# RCN Foundation education and career development grants for nurses, midwives and healthcare support workers

The <u>RCN Foundation Autumn education and career development grants</u> support those working within nursing and midwifery to develop professionally, upskill themselves and enhance the care they give to patients. ## The RCN Foundation Amin Abdullah Grant

Launched in 2022, the RCN Foundation Amin Abdullah Grant focuses on the mental health and well-being of nurses. The fund was created in memory of nurse Amin Abdullah. The award will provide grants of up to £1,000 to nurse-led projects that focus on nurses' well-being.

Applications are open to registered nurses from across the UK and applicants do not have to be a member of the RCN to apply. The grant is now open and will close at 5pm on 10 October.

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
