

Resilience Based Clinical Supervision CALL FOR RBCS EVALUATIONS



Have you implemented the Resilience-based Clinical Supervision (RBCS) Model in your workplace? Have you seen changes in staff wellbeing, clinical practice, or team culture?

We are inviting to individuals and organisations that have implemented the RBCS Champion and Cascade Programme to submit an abstract showcasing your evaluation or evaluation proposal.

The highest-scoring submissions will be invited to present their work in the form of a poster at the RBCS Evaluation Event, taking place in Nottingham on Thursday 07 January 2027. This is an exciting opportunity to share your achievements, celebrate success, and contribute to the growing evidence base for RBCS.

The event aims to:

- Evaluate the longer-term impact of the RBCS programme in practice
- To explore the impact of RBCS and what changes this has resulted in in practice
- To co-produce a research strategy to utilise to seek future funding for research into impact/support participants to evaluate in practice
- To consider new ways we can evidence the impact of RBCS

As a charity, FoNS is committed to understanding and evidencing the impact of its programmes. Your evaluation will help us learn more about outcomes for participants, the teams they work alongside, the people they care for, and the organisations they serve.

What we are looking for?

We are inviting submissions of an abstract (300–500 words) showcasing your evaluation or evaluation proposal that demonstrate the impact of implementing RBCS within your organisation (Template on page 2).

The purpose of your evaluation should be to explore:

- Participants' experiences of RBCS.
- Learning and development resulting from the programme.

The impact of RBCS on individuals, teams, and/or organisations.

Both qualitative and quantitative methods are welcome. You may also wish to evaluate outcomes that are particularly relevant to your organisation's local priorities and objectives.

To ensure your evaluation follows appropriate ethical guidance, please seek advice from your organisation's Research and Development Department where applicable. You may also find the [Health Research Authority guidance](#) useful in determining whether ethical approval is required.

An evaluation poster template can be provided upon request .

- Open to anyone who has completed the FoNS Resilience-based Clinical Supervision Champion and Cascade Programme.
- The selected applicants will be invited to deliver a 15-minute presentation at the evaluation event.
- The selected applicants will be required to bring your printed poster with you to be displayed at the event (further information will be provided)
- Prizes will be awarded to the top three posters, as judged on the day.
- All entrants will be invited to attend the event.
- Submission Deadline: Friday 30th October 2026
